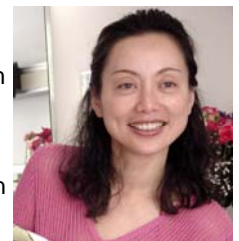

Next week's Speaker

Nancy Lin ([blog](#)) is a marketing consultant and a coach, specializing in life and business transformation. Previously she worked in marketing for Pepsi, Johnson & Johnson, Yahoo and DHL in the U.S., Asia and Latin America. In 2006 she began working independently in Tanzania and created her own agricultural training program for farmers in the remote mountains of Tanzania with the help of local experts. Later she partnered with a professional midwifery school in Mexico and helped raise money in Mexico for building a new campus for the indigenous in the state of Chiapas. Nancy brought on the first Mexican corporate sponsor and funding from a Mexican foundation for the school which had depended exclusively on the support of international organizations in the past.



In this motivational speech, Nancy Lin shares her experience in international development through mesmerizing photos of Tanzania and Mexico, and tells the stories of how she inspired change and leveraged challenges to make an impact on her projects. She poses provocative questions throughout her presentation to encourage the audience to examine how they live and work. The presentation challenges the audience to be the domino for change and expand themselves beyond their limitations to live up to their potential.
